One of Germany's oldest university cities and, thanks to its large student population, one of its youngest. Founded in the 15th century, the Eberhard Karls University has counted Kepler, Hegel and Hölderlin among its students.

The medieval old town survived the Second World War intact with its timber-framed houses and winding alleys unchanged for centuries.

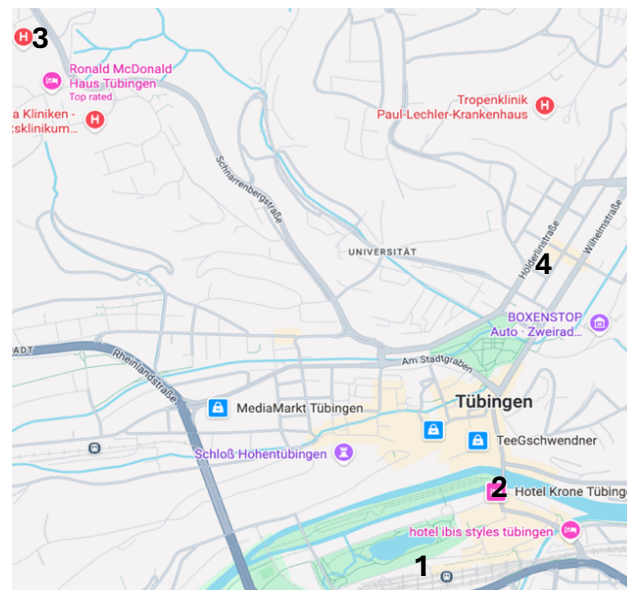

The bus service is excellent in Tübingen and will bring you to all important locations. From the main station [1] or Neckarbrücke [2], you can take bus 5, 13, 18 and 19 to reach the Geo- and Environmental Center (GUZ) at bus stop “**BG Unfallklinik**” [3].

For something more elegant within walking distance from the conference venue, try Hofgut Rosenau (reservation required).

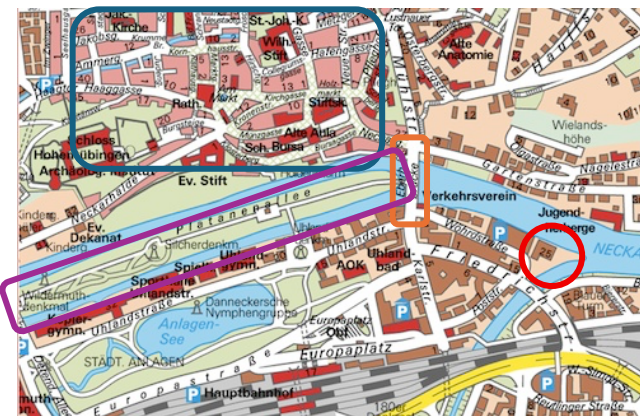
Evening drinks: Boulanger is a nice place for an evening drink. You can also bring your own food.
